Cities of refuge were created so people had a place to go for safety purposes. The Torah commanded Jews to set up cities of refuge. This meant that the person who accidentally killed could run and be safe from the victim's family. Once the person is in the city of refuge, the victim's family could not hurt them. That person had to stay in that city of refuge for a long time until the high priest meaning the kohen gadol would die. Before the Jews went off to war, the kohen gadol would come telling them that there was no reason to fear their enemies.
